

How to use electricity in Vietnam?

If you go to Vietnam it is useful to know something about the electricity, for example if you need a world plug or travel adapter. This is the most common outlet: In short, plug type A (two flat vertical pins), type C and type F (two round pins) fit most sockets in Vietnam. The following 3 adapters can be used without problems in Vietnam:

Do I need a power adapter in Vietnam?

Whether you'll need a power adapter depends on the type of plug your devices use. Here's a breakdown based on travelers from different countries and continents: In North America, the standard plug types are Type A and Type B, with a voltage of 120V. Since Vietnam uses Type A, C, and F outlets, you'll need a Type A/B to Type C/F adapter.

Do you need a voltage converter in Vietnam?

You might need an adapter or plug converterwhile you're in Vietnam if your devices don't come with one. The plugs used in Vietnam are two-pin plugs, which are slightly different from the three-pin plugs you might see in other countries.

What plug types are used in Vietnam?

Vietnam uses three different plug types: A,C,and D. Plug type A has two flat parallel pins,plug type C is the standard European plug with two round pins,and plug type D has three round pins with one larger than the other two. The country uses a standard voltage of 220 volts and a frequency of 50 Hz.
